Extracurricular Distinctives

SACS athletic teams compete in Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS) football, cross country, volleyball, basketball, soccer, track, baseball, softball, tennis and golf. SACS is a TAPPS 5A Class school and competes in the second largest division in TAPPS. During the 2022-2023 school year, our athletic teams earned two TAPPS 5A State Championships.

SACS Fine Arts department offers performing art courses in band, jazz band, praise band, choir, technical theatre, and theatre arts. Regular programs include plays, concerts, and a yearly musical. Visual Art courses include art, art portfolio, drawing, painting, ceramics, graphic arts, digital arts, cinematography, photography, and yearbook. Additional electives are offered in journalism and broadcast journalism.

Community Service Hours

Service is an integral part of San Antonio Christian High School. We require a minimum of 24 hours of service to a non-profit or Christian organization per academic year in high school.

Grade Average Computation

A student's grade point average (GPA) is calculated based upon semester grades in all courses from the beginning of ninth grade.

Due to an exceptional level of difficulty, semester grades for Honors (H) courses are given an extra GPA weight of 0.5.

Semester grades for Advanced Placement and Dual Credit (AP/DC) courses are given an extra GPA weight of 1.0. The extra weight is reflected in the student's semester GPA calculation.

Class Rank

Due to small class size in our rigorous college preparatory curriculum, class rank is not necessarily an accurate representation of the caliber of a particular student at SACS. Individual class rank is used to determine the Valedictorian and Salutatorian. As a limited-ranking school, SACS only reports class rank for students in the top ten percent of their class. Class rank is determined by the GPA earned during 9th-12th grades. Advanced Placement (AP), Dual Credit (DC), and Honors (H) courses are weighted.

2023 Scholarships and Grants Awarded

As of May 2023 the San Antonio Christian School graduating class of 2023 was awarded scholarships totaling **\$5,413,550**.

2023 Post-High School Placement

Graduates of the class of 2023 received acceptances from 51 institutions of higher learning. Ninety-eight percent of the graduating class matriculated to 28 colleges and universities in 11 states across the United States.
